Cancellations: All cancellation requests must be submitted in writing to the Camp Director no later than 5pm on the Thursday prior to the enrolled session. Cancellations submitted by the deadline will be refunded, minus a \$25 cancellation fee per week, per child. No refunds will be issued for requests submitted after the deadline without a physician's note for illness or injury.

Transfers: All transfer requests must be submitted in writing to the Camp Director and will only be processed if space allows. After June 1, all transfers will incur a \$10 fee per week, per child. Refund/Transfer Policy

Deposits are non-refundable under any circumstances. Up to seven days before the beginning of the specific camp session, all funds, less the deposit, are refundable and transferable within other day camp programs. This includes transfers to a new session and/or current day camp balance dues.

Within seven days all funds are non-refundable and non-transferable to a balance due or new registration. A written physician-authorized note verifying illness or injury is required in order to obtain a refund if a child cancels within seven days of the session start date. If a camper fails to show for a registered session without notice, there will be no refund issued. In cases of homesickness, dismissal, or voluntary withdrawal, there will be no refund of any fees.

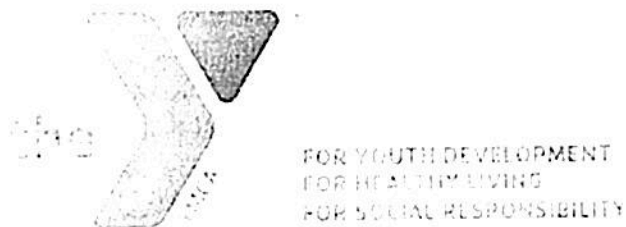

Is it possible to join the Y for free?

What are the application deadlines:

Scholarships are awarded on the 1st and the 15th of each month. If you submit your application between the 15th and 31st, your membership will be approved for the 15th of the following month.

If I receive financial assistance, what is expected of me?

- Upon approval, the YMCA will email scholarship applicants notifying the portion you will be asked to pay.
- Once you have received the email notification, you must come into the YMCA to accept the scholarship and make your first month's payment to activate your Open Arms membership.
- All Open Arms Scholarships are granted for six months.
- The YMCA requests that individuals and families reapply biannually, with updated documentation.
- If you do not reapply at the time requested, your membership will expire.
- Membership fees are subject to change when you reapply.
